

ADVENT



Today we begin our yearly pilgrimage through the events of our history of salvation starting with the preparation for the birthday celebration of Jesus and ending with the reflection on his glorious "second coming" as

judge at the end of the world. We are entering the Advent season. Advent means coming. We are invited to meditate on Jesus' first coming in history as a baby in Bethlehem, his daily coming into our lives in mystery through the Sacraments, through the Bible and through the worshipping community and finally his *Second Coming* at the end of the world to reward the just and to punish the wicked.

- * Start a new tradition for Advent—Beginning
 December 1st read one chapter of the book of
 Luke in the Bible each evening. There are 24
 chapters. On Christmas Eve you will have read an
 entire account of Jesus' life and wake up Christmas
 morning knowing WHO and WHY we celebrate!

While we typically regard Advent as a joyous season, it is also intended to be a period of preparation, much like Lent. Prayer, penance and fasting are appropriate during this season.

The purple colour associated with Advent is also the colour of penance. We see the traditional signs of Advent in our Church: violet vestments and hangings, plain green plants and the Advent wreath. These signs remind us that we must prepare for the rebirth of Jesus in our hearts and lives, enabling him to radiate his love, mercy, compassion and forgiveness around us.

- * Rest in God's presents.




JOKE OF THE WEEK
