Home Learning

At Good Shepherd Catholic Primary School, we recognise that parents are partners in their children's learning. Home Learning experiences provide opportunities for students to become more responsible for their own learning and growth.

Reading- It is expected that you read with your child every night. Whilst some children will be bringing home readers, do not limit your shared reading experiences to these texts. If you can, we ask that you consider volunteering half an hour of your time one morning to give our students an extra opportunity reading aloud. The links below provide some useful information on reading with your child.

Spelling/ Sight Words - As part of our weekly spelling program, students practice strategies based on their spelling words for the week. Weekly lists focus on a specific strategy/rule to consolidate learning. Students will continue to learn sight/high frequency words that are often not able to be sounded out.

Reading Eggs and Mathletics - Reading Eggs and Mathletics passwords have been provided to your child. Please work through both programs at your child's pace.

English - The students will participate in modelled, shared, guided and independent reading and writing experiences. Students will explore the five spelling strategies; sound, visual, meaning, connecting and checking. Students will practice reading strategies using suitable texts.

Mathematics - The students will be investigating a range of mathematical concepts. They will develop their number skills including place value, money and the four operations in number. In the measurement strand, the students will learn to read analogue time to the minute and convert metric units. In geometry, they will be exploring 3D shapes and angles. Students will conduct simple surveys to collect and analyse information in the data and statistics unit.

Physical Education and Health - The students will participate in cooperative games to develop team skills and apply rules fairly. They will refine fundamental movement skills in a variety of physical activities and sport clinics. In Health, they will investigate how emotional responses vary and understand how to interact positively with others in a variety of situations. They will learn the benefits of being healthy and physically active. We will be exploring wellbeing and safety through the Protective Behaviours program.

Religious Education - The students will identify prayers of thanksgiving and prayers of praise including Glory Be to the Father and demonstrate an understanding of the significance of these forms of prayer for Christians. They participate respectfully in a variety of prayer experiences including prayers of thanksgiving, praise and meditative prayer practices with mindful listening and guided meditation. In Term 3, all Year Three students will participate in the Sacramental program. For students who will be receiving the Sacraments in our parish, please see dates below.
