Mathletics

Mathletics passwords have been provided to your child. Please work through the program at your child's pace.

Personal reading

Students are encouraged to read at least 30 minutes a day. This should be a written or digital text. Audio books are an alternative.

Google Classroom

Classroom learning material will be posted on Google Classroom on a week-to-week basis depending on what topics are being taught in class. Students will gain an upper hand by viewing the material, answering questions and discussing opinions and thoughts with families. We encourage parents to check their email for weekly classroom reports to know what learning is occuring in class. Please make sure your email addresses are up to date with the front office. At times during the year, homework projects will be sent home. These will be posted through Google Classroom.

English

Students extend their reading range and stamina through modelled, guided and independent learning opportunities. Explicit grammar, punctuation and spelling is taught in the context of writing and according to student need. Students write for a variety of purposes and audiences and will be involved in determining the success criteria for their writing. Speaking and listening skills are incorporated daily in class and small group discussions. Formal skills are taught in preparation for Rostrum and presentations of learning through showcases.

Mathematics

Students continue to build upon the application of skills and knowledge in the core areas of number, probability, data, measurement and geometry. They are encouraged to develop thinking and confidence to explain their solutions and share different ideas.

Physical Education and Health

Students will be learning a range of skills and working cooperatively in the following sports: Oztag, Yulunga Indigenous games, basketball, cross country, athletics, gaelic football, cricket, netball and tennis. Exploration of the Health curriculum includes, emotional regulation, applying decision and problem solving to enhance health, safety and wellbeing.

Religious Education

Students will be learning about what prayer is and why we pray. They will explore Scripture from the Old and New Testament. Reflective prayer journaling and Christian meditation are two prayer experiences that students will reflect on this term. Students will be relating the Catholic Christian worldview to their own lives and acting in ways that share the message of Jesus.
