Students will create texts, drawing on their own experiences, their imagination and information they have learnt. They will explore the five spelling strategies; sound, visual, meaning, connecting and checking. Students will be explicitly taught the eight reading strategies using picture books and big books. They will use a variety of strategies to engage in group and class discussions, presentations and listening activities.

Mathematics - The students will recognise increasing and decreasing number sequences involving 2s, 3s and 5s. They will count to and from 1000. Students will begin to explore multiplication and division through grouping objects into sets. They will associate collections of Australian coins with their value. The students will draw and describe 2D shapes and recognise the features of 3D objects. They will explore addition and subtraction problems using a range of strategies. Halves, quarters and eighths of objects and groups will be identified. The students will tell the time to the quarter-hour and use a calendar to identify the date, months and seasons. They will collect, organise and represent data. Physical Education and Health - The students will participate in learning experiences to develop skills and knowledge about food and nutrition, health benefits of physical activity, mental health and wellbeing, relationships, safety. In PE we will focus on active play and minor games, fundamental movement skills and rhythmic and expressive movement activities.
